Opened as the first all-suite resort of its kind, Pointe Hilton Squaw Peak Resort is comfortable and inviting with fun for all ages, including a four-acre water park, miniature golf, kids camp program, full-service spa and historic BBQ restaurant. The resort's lush outdoor courtyards and flexible indoor/outdoor venues host memorable and productive meetings and

special events year round. Tucked within a neighborhood at the base of the Phoenix Mountain Preserve in uptown Phoenix, the resort is walking distance to urban hiking trails, popular local restaurants and is just minutes from the city's top attractions.

Accommodations

With all-suite accommodations, each of the 563 suites feature separate living and sleeping areas. Standard Suites, Studio Suites, Ambassador Suites, newly renovated Agave Suites, a Grande Suite and nearly 80 Casita Suites are also available. Casita Suites offer villa-style accommodations complete with refrigerators, microwaves and private parking.

The redesigned Agave Suites at North Pointe introduce an elevated guest experience enhanced by an elite suite selection, a personalized service culture, the addition of a private lobby concierge and exclusive access to the Agave Pool. The 224 remastered suites reflect a warm, neutral color palette featuring timeless, modern upgrades including contemporary furnishings, new carpeting and tile, desert-inspired art and decorative lighting.

Amenities





River Ranch Four acres of cascading waterfalls, secluded waterways, three swimming pools, a half-mile lazy river for tubing, 18-hole putting course and a 130-foot waterslide – all back dropped by dramatic mountain scenery. Additionally, River Ranch is home of the 3,000-square-foot Rodeo Drive retail center and Cactus Rock Creamery, an adventure center for Coyote Camp children’s program, Slim Picken’s grill and poolside activities programs. In addition to River Ranch, the resort features five other pools conveniently located throughout the property.

Tocasierra Spa & Salon With over 10,000 square feet of spa and salon amenities including state-of-the-art fitness equipment, steam and sauna, private lap pool and whirlpool as well as a wide variety of fitness classes, Tocasierra specializes in indulgent and contemporary spa treatments and invigorating fitness offerings including group hikes within the adjacent Phoenix Mountain Reserve. Spa guests under the age of 12 are also welcome to enjoy fun a variety of fun and whimsical treatments on the Kids Collection spa menu.



Coyote Camp Year-round kids camp programs are offered for children ages 4-12 at Coyote Camp. With half day, full day and evening camps available, each day at camp includes educational events and activities as well as swimming excursions and more.

Dining

Hole-In-The-Wall Located in an old 1940s ranch house, the historic building now offers a hearty selection of traditional barbecue fare aptly named Hole-in-the-Wall. Using a vintage outdoor smoker and barbecue pit to prepare mouthwatering dishes, menu favorites include 14-Hour Smoked Brisket, Smoke Chicken, Whole Grilled Trout, Baby Back Ribs, Bog Boy Mac and Cheese, and more. Open seasonally for breakfast, lunch and dinner.



Rico's American Grill A casual neighborhood hotspot featuring American classics with a Southwestern twist and a full bar with signature infused craft cocktails and beers, menu offerings include fresh and flavorful meals for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Guests with four-legged friends can enjoy Rico's Backyard, offering pet-friendly outdoor seating, games and cozy fire pits.



Resort History

In the 1970s, the Gosnell Development Corporation purchased the abandoned Cactus Rock Lodge and surrounding area with a vision to create the Valley's premier resort. In 1977, Gosnell's vision came into fruition when the Pointe at Squaw Peak opened its doors. Complete with exceptional amenities and service, family-friendly activities and unique dining options, the Pointe at Squaw Peak quickly became one of the top places to stay in the Valley. The Gosnells also transformed the Cactus Rock Lodge into the Hole-in-the-Wall Eatin' and Drinkin' place, which soon became a popular dining destination in Phoenix with its Old West atmosphere. The Pointe at Squaw Peak was purchased in 1991 by Hilton and was renamed Pointe Hilton Squaw Peak.
