At Musket Cove, we care about the health and welfare of our employees, our guests, our community & our planet.

In recent months we have collaborated with both the Fiji Ministry of Forestry and Ministry of Fisheries, to protect our natural resources for today, and future generations.

What makes these initiatives more exciting is how much interest our local communities have shown, and their willingness to participate.

Our primary initiatives embrace our wetlands and surrounding reefs. Work has commenced on regenerating nature's nursery by planting 5,000 Mangrove saplings, build and nurture a coral farm with several coral species and a giant clam nursery. These majestic animals are in dire need of protection.

Another unique initiative is one that means a lot to our Director Josephine Smith Moffat. Restoring and regenerating Malolo Lailai with native species vegetation.

*"Our target is to plant 10,000 native species trees and shrubs over a 5-year period. To date 2019, we have successfully planted our first 1,000. Including Dakua, Koka, Marasa, Vesiwai, Vesi, Ivi."* says Mrs Smith Moffat

We are well on the way on reducing single use plastics. All takeaway containers are either biodegradable or reconstituted sugar cane, multi-use bags, paper straws and ongoing awareness and reward scheme for our staff have been initiated.

We grind glass back to sand for use in building materials, recycle plastic bottles, glass and metal, garden refuse is chipped and mulched. Eventually making its way into our gardens and organic farm.

We are proudly Fijian and confident that every small step we make, helps toward reducing our footprint on our ever so fragile planet.
