ACTIVITIES	GORDON RIVER CRUISE	Activity Type: Cruise Capacity (pax): 190 Duration: 6 hours	Begin your cruise across Macquarie Harbour—a vast body of water that measures six times the size of Sydney Harbour. See the world-famous reflections on the Gordon River, while cruising quietly under <i>Spirit of the Wild's</i> electric motors. Wander amongst the largest tract of temperate rainforest on earth. After a lunch, explore Sarah Island; once a dreaded penal colony and the largest boat building settlement in the British colonies. Your guide will recount astonishing stories of the convicts, soldiers, settlers and shipwrights who lived and worked here. Audio tours available in French, German, Mandarin and Cantonese.
	BONNET ISLAND EXPERIENCE	Activity Type: Cruise Capacity (pax): 11 Duration: 2.5 hours	Take a fast cruiser from Strahan and step ashore on Bonnet Island at the mouth of the harbour. Once home to lighthouse keepers and their families, today Bonnet Island is the home to a thriving colony of one of Tasmania's most fascinating bird species - The Little Penguin. Enjoy the privilege of seeing the world's smallest penguins returning to their burrows at dusk having spent the day at sea fishing.
	THE SHIP THAT NEVER WAS	Activity Type: Theatre Capacity (pax): 200 Duration: 1hr 15min	Australia's longest running play tells the dramatic and hilarious true story of the Great Escape from Sarah Island! It's January 1834. The <i>Frederick</i> , the last ship built at the convict settlement of Sarah Island in Macquarie Harbour, is about to sail for the new prison at Port Arthur. Ten convict shipwrights have other ideas. So begins the story of an amazing escape, an extraordinary voyage with an intriguing twist.
	WEST COAST WILDERNESS RAILWAY	Activity Type: Railway Journey Capacity (pax): 110 Duration: Full/Half day	Formerly known as the 'Abt Railway', this rack and pinion system wrestles steep gorges, thick forests and wild rivers and is considered to be one of Australia's engineering marvels. Depart from the original harbour side Regatta Point Station in Strahan. Take in the fabulous harbour views as the train follows the foreshore and then the river as you journey deep into the rainforest and crossing the many bridges, including the formidable iron bridge.
	HOGARTH FALLS	Activity Type: Walk Duration: 1 hour Cost: Free	This easy 1.3 return walk from Strahan Village takes you through cool temperate rainforest with remnant swamp gums, Sassafras, leatherwood and myrtle towering overhead. The walk follows Botanical Creek, the home to a variety of native fish and the elusive platypus. Arrive at the foot of these wide, flat falls that can trickle and glisten or rush with the power from a heavy down pour.

FROM HOBART	MONA houses a collection that ranges from ancient Egyptian mummies to the world's most infamous and contemporary art. The subterranean design and the unconventional curatorial approach make it a must-see for any visitor to Australia.	REDLANDS ESTATE AND DISTILLERY , once the home of George the IV's son. This Convict-built property produces its own barley used in their distillery. SALMON PONDS , set in beautiful grounds amongst century-old trees. The first brown trout in Australia were hatched in 1864.	MT FIELD NATIONAL PARK take a 10 minute walk through the ferns and rainforest to the much-photographed spectacular Russell Falls and Lady Barron Falls.	MT LYELL MINE TOURS take you underground to reveal Queenstown's rich mining history.
	BRICKENDON is a convict built village and working farm with friendly sheep, a range of poultry, horses, goats and a pig called Flora to play with as you explore the Brickendon Farm Village.	CHRISTMAS HILLS RASPBERRY FARM let you sample some of the delicious berry creations, including ice-cream, cakes and muffins at their farm gate providore.	ASHGROVE FARM CHEESE gives visitors the chance to view cheese making and maturing and then enjoy from the tasting door. SHEFFIELD ; a beautiful town now famous for its extensive display of murals.
